Three Additional compulsories:

- Group 1: 1 additional credit in English, or French as a second language, or a Native Language, or a classical or an international language, or social science and the humanities or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or co-operative education. ▲
- Group 2: 1 additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies or co-operative education, ▲
- Group 3: 1 additional credit in science or computer studies or technological education or co-operative education. ▲

In addition to the compulsory credits, students must complete:

- ✓ 12 optional credits ■
- ✓ The provincial literacy requirement
- ✓ 40 hours of community involvement
- ♦ a maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.
- ▲ a maximum of 2 credits in co-operative education can count as compulsory credits.
- may include up to four credits achieved through approved dual credit courses.
